Rhymes for Young Ghouls

Crime, Drama (2013, R, 1h 28m) Wednesday, Nov. 2, 6 p.m.

In 1976, a Mi'gMaq teenager (Devery Jacobs) plots revenge against the Indian agent (Mark Antony Krupa) who imprisoned her in a residential school where abuse is common.

You will Die at Twenty Sudan, Drama (2019, NR, 1h 43m) Friday, November 4, 4 & 7 p.m.

A moving meditation on what it means to live in the present, this film is an auspicious debut and Sudan's first Oscar submission. Shortly after Muzamil is born, a traveling sheikh prophesizes he will die at 20, which makes his mother, Sakina overprotective all his life. As Muzamil grows older and escapes Sakina's ever-watchful eye, he encounters friends, ideas and challenges that make him question his destiny.

Smoke Signals

Comedy, Drama (1998, PG-13, 1h 29m) Wednesday, Nov. 9, 6 p.m.

A Native American (Adam Beach) sets off on a journey to recover the remains of his estranged father, learning some important lessons from a traveling companion (Evan Adams) and a woman (Irene Bedard) who knew his father.

This May Be the Last Time

Documentary, Drama, History (2014, NR, 1h 30m) Wednesday, Nov. 16, 6 p.m.

An investigation into Native American filmmaker Harjo's family history, namely the mysterious 1962 disappearance of his grandfather and the songs of encouragement sung by those who searched for him.

Hive

Kosovo, Drama (2021, NR, 1h 24m) Friday, November 18, 4 & 7 p.m.

Sundance triple award winner *Hive* is a searing drama based on the true story of Fahrije, who, like many of the other women in her patriarchal village, has lived with fading hope since her husband went missing during the war in Kosovo.

Incident at Oglala

Documentary, History (1992, PG, 1h 29m) Wednesday, Nov. 30, 6 p.m.

This film describes the events surrounding a 1975 shootout at the Pine Ridge reservation in South Dakota where two FBI agents were killed.

A Journal for Jordan
