OPERATIONS FUNDING PROGRAM FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ's)

FAQ'S

The City of Carlsbad is offering operational funding support to food recovery organizations servicing Carlsbad. The intent of funding an organization's operations is to support the City of Carlsbad in recovering surplus edible food from going to compost or landfill and to feeding people instead.

Through this funding, the City will support organizations in their efforts accepting and distributing additional edible food safely.

HOW MUCH FUNDING IS AVAILABLE FOR EACH ORGANIZATION?

WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBLE COSTS FOR THIS FUNDING?

The table below shows eligible costs and the metrics for tracking food recovery. If there are other operational costs that you think could measurably recover edible food in the City of Carlsbad, please contact City staff to discuss.

WHEN ARE THE APPLICATIONS DUE AND HOW LONG DOES THE FUNDING LAST?

The application acceptance will be on a rolling basis and City staff will be reviewing applications as submitted, providing no guarantees of funding. Funding will be provided as City funds are available.

ARE THERE OPTIONS TO EXTEND THE FUNDING AGREEMENT?

Each funding agreement will be valid for up to one year, or through April 15, 2024, with an option to extend for up to two additional one-year extensions, depending on availability of funds.

WHAT ARE THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS, IF GRANTED?

Invoices Due to City Staff	Monthly, fifteenth of the month
Food Recovery Progress Reports Due	 July 15, 2023, Agreement start date through June 30, 2023 January 15, 2024, for the period July 1, 2023-December 31, 2023 April 15, 2024, for the period January 1, 2024-March 31, 2024 (end of Year 1 Agreement) If the Agreement is renewed, additional progress reports will be due.

DOES MY ORGANIZATION NEED TO BE A NOT FOR-PROFIT?

No. Any organization that meets the eligibility requirements can apply.

ARE MILEAGE AND MATERIALS ALLOWABLE EXPENSES?

No. Mileage nor materials are allowable expenses. This funding is intended to assist food recovery organizations with existing, additional, or other operations with the intent to increase edible food recovery. Applicants should provide fully burdened hourly rates. Please see Eligible Costs and Metrics.

WHAT ARE THE INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS?

Applicants will be required to meet the City's insurance requirements throughout the term of the agreement. The specific requirements are provided in **EXHIBIT C** of the Sample Agreement, which can be accessed at the City's website here.

Within ten (10) working days after city's notification of award of contract to Applicant, all required insurance documents must be submitted to Contract Administration. Applicant's failure to provide the city-required insurance certificates showing specified coverage within this time frame may be cause for the contract award to be rescinded at the city's sole discretion.

All certificates of insurance for auto policies must:

- 1) Meet the conditions stated in the included contract for each insurance company that the Applicant proposes.
- 2) Cover any vehicle used in the performance of the contract, used onsite or offsite, whether owned, non-owned or hired, and whether scheduled or non-scheduled. The auto insurance certificate must state the coverage is for "any auto" and cannot be limited in any manner.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE APPLICATION?

If applicants meet eligibility requirements, applicants must provide the following to City Staff via the online application form accessible at the City's website here:

- 1. Project team and approach
- 2. Three project reference summaries
- 3. Rate schedule (see rate schedule template available at the City's website)

Before completing the online application form, applicants should familiarize themselves with the application format and requirements by referring to the sample application form, also accessible at the City's website.
