- When it's your turn, the City Clerk will call your name and invite you to the podium.
- Speakers have three minutes, unless the presiding member changes that time.
- You may not give your time to another person, but can create a group. A group must select a
 single speaker as long as three other members of your group are present. All forms must be
 submitted to the Clerk before the item begins and will only be accepted for items listed on the
 agenda (not for general public comment at the beginning of the meeting). Group representatives
 have 10 minutes unless that time is changed by the presiding officer or the City Council.
- In writing: Comments received by 5 p.m. the day prior to the meeting will be shared with the committee prior to the meeting. When e-mailing comments, please identify in the subject line the agenda item to which your comments relate. All comments received will be included as part of the official record. Written comments will not be read out loud.
