# Why Recycle?

**It's the law!** In July 2012, through Assembly Bill 341 (AB341) the State of California established a goal to divert at least **75% of waste from landfills by the year 2020**. AB 341 requires that businesses and multifamily complexes implement a recycling program. In addition to state laws, the City of Carlsbad requires the separation of recycling and trash as per Carlsbad Municipal Code section 6.08.020.









It's easy! Recycling at home, school, and your workplace can be easy and convenient. In Carlsbad, residents can recycle paper, cardboard, plastic, bottles, cans, and other materials. This guide will help you identify the materials that can be recycled in your community.

It creates jobs! It is a mainstream industry accounting for approximately **85,000 jobs and producing \$10 billion in products and services** per year. That's equivalent to the size of the movie industry in California.

It saves energy! It takes 95% less energy to make an aluminum can out of recycled aluminum than out of raw virgin materials. Making glass from recycled material allows manufacturers to run their furnaces at lower temperatures, which saves energy.

Did You Know? 75% of our waste is recyclable!

It preserves natural resources! Reducing, reusing, and recycling cuts down on the amount of raw material needed to create new products, lessening the overall impact on natural resources. And by sending less material to landfills, Americans can put a dent in the amount of trash we produce each day.

# You can make a difference!

**Learn** about what materials are recyclable in your community.

**Avoid** contamination; when trash is mixed with recyclables it all goes to the landfill. When in doubt, leave it out!

**Encourage** family, friends, and neighbors to recycle!

# **Tips For A Successful Recycling Program At Your Complex**

## Residents

Inside this guide you will find all the information you need to recycle like a pro!

- **1. Request recycling information** from your property manager upon moving into your complex.
- **2. Know what belongs** in the recycling container, the trash container and what to do with hazardous waste.
- **3. Know the locations** of the containers nearest you.
- **4. Moving in?** Check with your property manager on how to properly recycle cardboard boxes at your complex.
- 5. Moving out? For disposal of large or bulky items you can call Waste Management at 760-929-9400 for a FREE bulky item pick up of up to 5 items 3 times per year. You may need to coordinate with your property manager.
- **6. Think if** you can reuse, repurpose, repair or donate materials before throwing them away. Visit WasteFreeSD.org for more ideas.



## **Property Managers**

Make it easy! Educate your residents on recycling best practices at your complex!

- Contact City of Carlsbad Recycling Program staff for assistance setting up a recycling program at your multifamily complex.
- **2. Introduce new residents** to your property's recycling program as soon as they move in. If possible, do a walk-through of the property and visit the recycling area.
- 3. Assist residents with signage on or near containers explaining proper sorting of recyclables. This information should be clearly legible and include pictures to assist residents with what goes in what container.
- **4. Make sure containers are located** in high traffic, convenient areas and are labeled properly with pictures of what is recyclable or not recyclable.
- 5. Provide reminders to residents on the importance of responsible recycling behavior. With every newsletter or community notice, remind residents that you care about the community and reemphasize the value of recycling.
- 6. Work with Waste Management to see what size container would suit your multifamily complex. Plan out how many you might need depending on the size of your complex. You might need larger or smaller containers than you think. Getting the right size containers can prevent overfilling and may save you money.
- **7. Provide this guide** or information upon move in to all incoming residents so they can be contributors to the success of the recycling program right away.
- **8.** As residents move out, provide information on where they can donate their gently used materials or properly dispose of those materials that cannot be donated.



# **Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Options**

Household hazardous waste must be disposed of properly because these materials contain ingredients that are dangerous to people, animals and the environment. It is illegal to dispose of toxic material in the trash. Carlsbad residents have several options for proper disposal of household hazardous waste.

#### **Household Hazardous Waste**

Some examples of household hazardous waste are:

Cleaners/Bleach/DisinfectantsPesticides/Fertilizers/Weed Killers

Auto Filter/Fluids/Batteries

Household Batteries

- Fluorescent/CFL Bulbs
- Paint/Varnish/Stains
- Bug Sprays
- E-Waste
- Sharps/Needles
- Pharmaceuticals



#### **Electronic/Universal Waste**

Many electronic products can be reused, refurbished or recycled. Carlsbad residents can help reduce waste by discarding electronic waste at one of the household hazardous waste facilities, or Waste Management's Buyback Center. Residents can also schedule a bulky item/electronic waste collection through Waste Management or a door-to-door pick-up through Stericycle. Some common electronic products are:

- Computers
- Printers
- Fax Machines
- Microwave Ovens
- Televisions
- DVD Players

- VCRs
- Stereos
- Cell Phones



## **Sharps and Needles**

Carlsbad residents may take their sharps or needles to a household hazardous waste facility and place them in the authorized container at the facility. Waste Management also offers residents the option to drop off sharps and needles at the Buyback Center, located at 5960 FLO

at the Buyback Center, located at 5960 El Camino Real in Carlsbad.

The city has contracted with Waste Management to provide residents with a limited number of free mail-back sharps kits that are available at their main office located at 5960 El Camino Real in Carlsbad. These kits include an approved sharps container and a postage prepaid mail-back box for convenient sharps disposal. Due to limited availability, each household will be limited to one mail-back kit per year. Please call Waste Management at 760-929-9400 for more information.

### **Pharmaceuticals**

The City of Carlsbad in partnership with Waste Management provides an annual pharmaceutical collection event. For more information on this event please check the city's website.



You may also utilize the dropoff program established by the San Diego County Sheriff's Department. Residents are able to drop-off pharmaceuticals anonymously 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Drop box locations and more information is available here:

The city also provides a safe, anonymous disposal drop box at the City of Carlsbad Safety Center, 2560 Orion Way, Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Please do not flush unwanted pharmaceuticals down the toilet due to detrimental environmental effects on recycled and treated water.

## **Drop off Locations**

Household hazardous waste collection service is provided by Waste Management and Stericycle. This drop-off service is **free** with proof of residency.

#### **Door-to-Door**

The City of Carlsbad provides service through Stericycle to collect household hazardous waste material from the front door of residents' homes for a \$10 fee. This service is available by appointment only. Please call Stericycle at 800-714-1195 to schedule collection.

# Other Recycling & Disposal Services Available in Carlsbad

# Items too big for the recycle or trash container? Schedule a bulky item collection.

Waste Management provides free collection of up to five large items such as furniture or appliances from your home three times annually. To schedule a bulky item pick up, contact Waste Management at 866-WM RECYCLE or 760-929-9400 at least 24 hours in advance of your regular collection day. You may need to coordinate with your property manager. Acceptable bulky items:





- Barbeque (no propane tank)
- Basketball Hoop (6 feet or less)
- Bath Tub (no shower)
- Bed Frame
- Bookshelf
- Boxspring/Mattress
- Chair/Recliner
- Closet Doors (2 non-glass)
- Computer/Monitor
- Couch/Sofa
- Desk
- Dishwasher
- Door
- Dresser
- Dryer
- File Cabinet
- Ladder (8 feet or less)
- Lawn Mower (no gas)
- Microwave Oven

- Mirrors (package between two pieces of cardboard, or completely tape with heavy duty tape to prevent shattering)
- Patio Furniture (one item)
- Printer
- Refrigerator/Freezer
- Rugs
- Sink
- Spa Cover (cut in half)
- Stove
- Swing Set (disassemble and bundle)
- Table (dining, end, coffee)
- Television
- Toilet
- Washer
- Water Heater (empty of water)
- Wood/Lumber (4'X18" bundles, 4 bundles equals one bulky item)

# **Recycling & Trash Separation**

## Recycle – You can place it in one bin!

Glass bottles, jars

Newspapers, inserts

Office papers

Cardboard egg cartons

Empty aerosol cans

Computer/white paper

Coupons

Brown paper bags

Cereal boxes (lining removed)

Tissue boxes

Clean pizza boxes

Laundry detergent boxes/bottles

# **Waste Hierarchy**

## Reduce

Reduction of materials is the best practice. Try to reduce packaging in particular when you purchase products, or plan ahead about your projected use of a product.

## Reuse/Repurpose

Think of ways you might be able to reuse a product or repurpose it for another task. Great examples of repurposing can be found at WasteFreeSD.org.

## Repair

Maybe your product can be repaired? There are tons of resources out there which can be cost effective and easier than disposal.

## **Donate**

Donating is a great option. Donate to organizations like Goodwill, the Salvation Army or your local religious organization to extend the lifespan of your items.

## Recycle

Look for your recycling container and consult with this guide to make sure the right items are going into the right container.

# **Move In, Move Out Tips**

- Donate old or unwanted goods, clothing, electronics, small appliances and furniture.
- Post on Craigslist, Facebook, Freecycle and other media outlets.
- Plan ahead, start collecting boxes and newspapers to wrap items.
- Recycle all cardboard boxes and newspaper, flatten boxes to save space in the recycling container.
- Leaving bulky items behind is considered illegal dumping. Contact Waste Management at 760-929-9400 to arrange for a bulky item pick up. You may need to coordinate with your property manager.


