ARTIST OVERVIEW

Mark Reigelman has exhibited work in public sites, galleries, and museums throughout the US. His work *Manifest Destiny!* (San Francisco, CA), *White Cloud* (Cleveland, OH), *Wood-Pile* (Cleveland, OH), *Upriver-Downriver* (Louisville, KY), *Smökers* (New York, NY), *Rock Box* (Cleveland, OH) and *The Meeting House* (Boston, MA) have been nationally recognized by the Americans for the Arts in their annual *Year in Review* as being amongst the "Best in Public Art" across the country. His newest site-specific installations include *Wheelhouse* in Arlington, VA, *The Makers Monument* in downtown Columbus, OH, *Groundswell* on the shore of the Potomac in Alexandria, and *Formation* at the San Diego International Airport. *The Makers Monument* was voted #1 Public Artwork in America in 2022 as part of the CODA Awards People's Choice ranking.

Reigelman has received two Windgate Fellowships from the Center of Craft Creativity and Design, the Graue Award from Southern Exposure, and the Brownstoner RADD award, which recognizes leaders in New York's Real Estate, Architecture, Design, and Development. His work has been included in exhibitions at the Shanghai Museum of Glass, The Cleveland Museum of Art, The Oklahoma City Museum of Art, The Shelburne Museum, the New Britain Museum of American Art, and The Museum of Modern Art (NYC). Reigelman's work has been featured in publications including The New York Times, New York Magazine, Frame (Netherlands), L'uomo Vogue (Italy), Public Design (Korea), Télé Star (France), Details, Interior Design, Sculpture, and Public Art Now. His work has also been highlighted in books such as *Uneven Growth: Tactical Urbanisms for Expanding Megacities* (MoMA), *Unexpected Art: Serendipitous Installations, Site-Specific Works, and Surprising Interventions* (Chronicle Books) and *Cause and Effect: Visualizing Sustainability* (Gestalten).

Reigelman is most proud of being included in the "Coolest Dads of 2019" list by Fatherly Magazine, which highlights the 50 coolest dads on earth. In the Innovation category, he shared this award with Jordan Peele, Kanye West, Adam Driver, and Hugh Herr.

Mark Reigelman studied sculpture and industrial design at the Cleveland Institute of Art in Cleveland, OH, and product design at Central St. Martin's College of Art and Design in London, UK. The artist lives and works in Brooklyn, NY, USA.

Dear members of Public Art Advisory Subcommittee,

My work reevaluates the everyday and reimagines gathering spaces. These public interventions attempt to reorient one's perception and inspire a renewed collective consciousness. By favoring the process of research and exploration, I have a unique body of work poised between abstraction and literal representation, guided by a clear conceptual foundation and whimsical synthesis. It is this bold, site-specific approach to public space that I hope to apply to the new artwork for the Veterans Memorial Park.

The project goal to create a space where we can recognize each other feels deeply tied to my personal investment in crafting installations for communities, as creating interventions that highlight the various identities of a space is exactly why I make art. My ethos is rooted in the notion that public art can act as a portal to other possible worlds, which viewers might traverse and inhabit. I look to engage individuals in new and exciting ways, urging viewers to interact with the site and one another. To achieve this, I take a research-centric approach, which helps to unearth lived and historical experiences that I use to help guide my design. An early stage of my process is outreach— it is essential to my practice to have conversations with the individuals connected to a particular space or discipline, which helps to unearth information that I otherwise wouldn't be able to extract. My work seeks to strike a balance between play and sophistication, to be as engaging with a child as it is with a professor.

One of my most vibrant suspended permanent public art projects is located outside the entrance to the San Diego International Airport's parking structure. *Formation* is a series of three massive tapestries made up of hundreds of individually cast resin airplanes strung to stainless steel aircraft carriers. Weaving together the histories of aeronautical innovation in the region through the specific aircraft represented with the fiber arts and crafting traditions of the indigenous peoples of the American Southwest, *Formation* sought to be meticulously site-specific in its conception and rendering. It was important to reflect the value the neighborhood placed on history and for the work to contrast the urban setting without drastically altering the visual landscape.

I feel it important to introduce a bold and welcoming statement to the site, in order to greet viewers with a sense of discovery and wonder. I would, furthermore, select the media for the project based on site-specific research with an emphasis on durability, sustainability, and limited long-term maintenance. My education and training within the disciplines of Sculpture and Industrial Design and my professional experience collaborating on multidisciplinary projects with architects, engineers and landscape architects highlight my abilities and strengths as a public artist. I would be thrilled to contribute my passion and vision for the new artwork at Veterans Memorial Park.






