Points of Interest

There are many hidden treasures hidden along the trails in Carlsbad. Please refer to the map within this guide to locate where these points of interest are located.

The Flower Fields

The Flower Fields are the only commercial ranunculus fields in the world that are open to the public. This wonderful annual display of horticultural beauty opens in March, welcoming visitors into a sea of color and aromatic delights. Visitors can view 50-plus acres of breathtaking Giant Tecolote Ranunculus, abundant roses in the All American Rose Garden, the world famous Ecke poinsettias, and tour the entire ranch on an exciting tractor ride that is fun for the whole family.

LEGOLAND® California

This world-renowned theme park is based on the popular building block toys created in Denmark in 1932 by Ole Kirk Christiansen, a carpenter from Billund, Denmark. The company name LEGO was coined by Christiansen from the Danish phrase "leg godt", which means "play well". The park is specifically geared towards children ages 2–12 and has more than 50 rides, shows and attractions for the whole family to enjoy.

Agua Hedionda Lagoon and The Discovery Center

This area, also known as Macario Canyon, was home to the Luiseño Indian tribe. All are encouraged to learn about the rich cultural history of this native American Indian tribe and the importance of the lagoon ecosystem.



Citywide Trail System

The goal of the citywide trails program is to meet the changing and emerging leisure and quality of life needs of Carlsbad residents, while supporting the protection and preservation of open spaces and connecting communities.

Leave your car behind and take a bike route or trail instead. The city's trails provide a comprehensive network for non-motorized transportation routes, connecting neighborhoods to commercial and business areas, schools, parks and Carlsbad beaches.

Trail Use Regulations

- 1. Stay on the designated trail. CPC 602
- 2. Put litter in containers provided. Do not leave or deposit any litter. CMC 11.32.030(1)
- 3. Pick up after your pet. CMC 7.08.010, SDCC 62.670
- 4. All pets must be on a hand-held leash under 6' long. CMC Sec. 7.08.010, SDCC Sec. 62.669
- 5. Bicycle riders 17 years and younger must wear a helmet. cvc 21212
- 6. Bicycles should be driven at safe speeds considering all other trail users.
- 7. Ride or walk on right side when traffic is coming from the opposite direction or when someone signals they would like to pass.
- 8. Motorized vehicles and horses are not allowed on this trail. (CMC Secs. 11.32.030(11), 11.32.030(19)
- No smoking, fires or firearms.
 CMC Secs. 11.32.030(2), 11.32.030(4), 11.32.110
- 10. Report accidents or emergencies to the Police Department (dial 9–1–1).
- 11. Report trails maintenance problems or vandalism to the Parks Maintenance division at 760-434-2824.
- 12. Report emergencies or violations of the above rules and regulations to the 24-hour police dispatch line 760-931-2197.

Trail Highlights

The trails located within and near The Crossings at Carlsbad provide a diverse and unique trail experience for everyone. Whether you're out on the trails for a recreational experience or as part of a fitness program, there's much to see and explore along the way. The Crossings Trail leads to the west of the golf course and down to Macario Creek where one can experience the diverse local riparian habitat. The trail joins a rustic golf cart bridge and path at the bottom of the canyon, and then continues to Veterans Memorial Park via a pedestrian tunnel under Faraday Avenue. Inside Veterans Memorial Park there are more primitive trails that can be hiked to high vistas with breathtaking views of the Agua Hedionda Lagoon and the Pacific Ocean.
