City of Carlsbad - Official Good question. Changes to the site's use will take some time to implement, and our goal was to get the trail ready for public use as quickly as possible in the meantime. Because the site is home to protected habitat, changes in use require a longer environmental review and permitting process than some other types of projects – in the three to four year range at a minimum.

Sherri Sullivan The City discussed a two year process in the recent council meeting. I've looked at existing fauna and flora data and have walked the site numerous times. The habitat in and adjacent to the City trail where dog owners have traditionally utilized is mostly non-native plants. Being familiar with the environmental review process, I don't foresee a prolonged consultation for protected species, it should be a fairly straightforward ER as long as the preserved area remains as designated. What can the community do to help?

#### Question 1: What would have made this meeting better?

- This workshop format was pedantic and degrading. The city staff treated the members of the community like children. The regimented format prevented a free exchange of ideas.
- Starting it out with the rules and what we are dealing with instead of softening it. But idk, maybe that worked.
- More concrete statistics and info.
- Pre-distributed information. A packet with all the constraints and laws that surround the city council's decision.
- It was great! I would appreciate a copy of the HMP on-site to reference and clarify definitions. Thank you!
- Better setting for sound quality though this neighborhood is directly impacted.
- If City Council was here.
- Use the big screen instead of moving to different easels.
- That we are heard! You listen but not really!!
- Better sound system.
- Please announce when will be getting back to all of us regarding this meeting?
- Ask people to list their residence. There were many non-Carlsbad residents here.

#### Question 2: What else would you like us to know?


- Hold a second community workshhop before city council

- The omnipresence of cameras everywhere by the City made me uncomfortable. It made me feel as if the City was pre-emptively documenting for possible future litigation. It felt weird and not conducive to a friendly discussion. \*Thank you very much for considering children in your planning.
- People have been using the trails. More community meetings.
- I'm concerned nobody is listening and not all infor will be fairly & accurately reported. Not happ about time frame!!! Took 3 months to schedule this meeting. Will take 3 months to submit info to the City Council. NOT OK!
- Please conduct several more community workshops so that we can all benefit from these gatherings - to everyone's satisfaction. Most sepcifically those of us who prefer to keep Village Trail H as the lovely off-leash nature trail that it is!
- I've never attendinded one of these before. I liked the discussion tables instead of listening to one speaker. Very interactive.

- 30+ years of off-leash usage is a big consideration, but adequate parking would be a must.
- We need to honor how the trail has already been used and make preserving that a priority.

- We are concerned that the data the city is gathering on wildlife movement is flawed.

- Another community meeting to see how City Council responded to our suggestions.




Question 1: Are you familiar with Village H, a piece of open space land on the corner of Carlsbad Village Drive and Victoria Lane in northwest Carlsbad?

I would hope that a compromise could be reached where maybe the upper trail behind the homes may be maintained as an off leash dog trail and the remainder of the property could be restricted to use, restored and used as a habitat corridor. There has been endless dog fights, encounters with hikers, people yelling to keep their dogs away, including away from children. The off leash dogs have devastated the bottom of my property by running along the fence line. The impact on my own pets was terrible. I had to get rid of my own dog because of its barking and interaction with other dogs that would bark at it and jump on the fence. The owners have never cleaned up after their pets and allow them to run through the trail area and off the trail area. I have no problem with dogs on leash under control, but this is not a place for dogs to be off leash. The area is too big and unconfined for control of dogs. Owners are often hundreds of feet from their animals and sometimes not in sight. It is dangerous and makes the trail that has potential to serve a large population, including handicapped and disabled and elderly from enjoying the trail. 1) We've been told that "historically" Village H has been used as an off-leash dog park. This is not accurate. We have lived here for thirty-three years, and "historically" everyone was able to walk the trail. However once the big off-leash dogs arrived, it was no longer safe for young children or small dogs, as the larger dogs are often quite aggressive (and perhaps why their owners bring them to Village H instead of the dog park one half mile away on CVD.) 2) Parking should be a priority concern. Parking along Victoria and Kingston during early morning and afterwork hours was already a problem near Village H, including illegal parking in front of the fire hydrant on Kingston. When officially opened to the public, it could be much worse. 3) Apparently Victoria Avenue has been renamed to "Victoria Lane" on the maps associated with the project. To be very clear: Victoria is no country lane. It is a connector used by many drivers to travel between Tamarack and CVD. The city seems to have implicitly recognized this by putting stop signs on every block of Victoria, as well as a crossing area on CVD. To sum up, between the number of cars traveling on Victoria, the potential increase in the number of parked cars, the number of off-leash dogs and their clueless owners who don't look both ways before crossing the street, I would think the city might want to consider their liability in case someone or their dog gets hurt.
