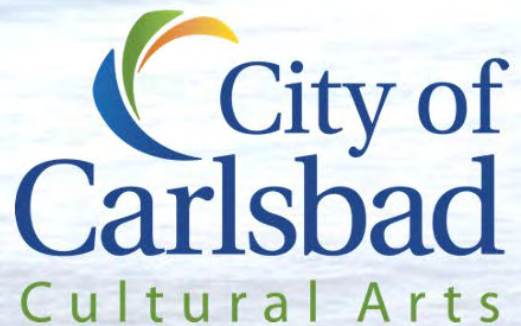

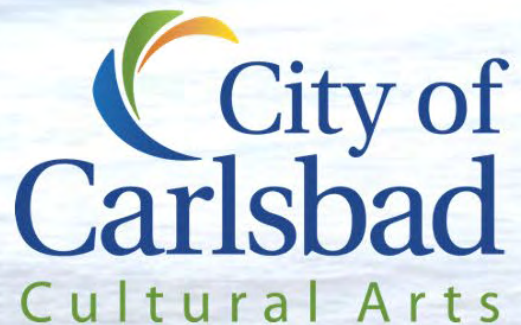

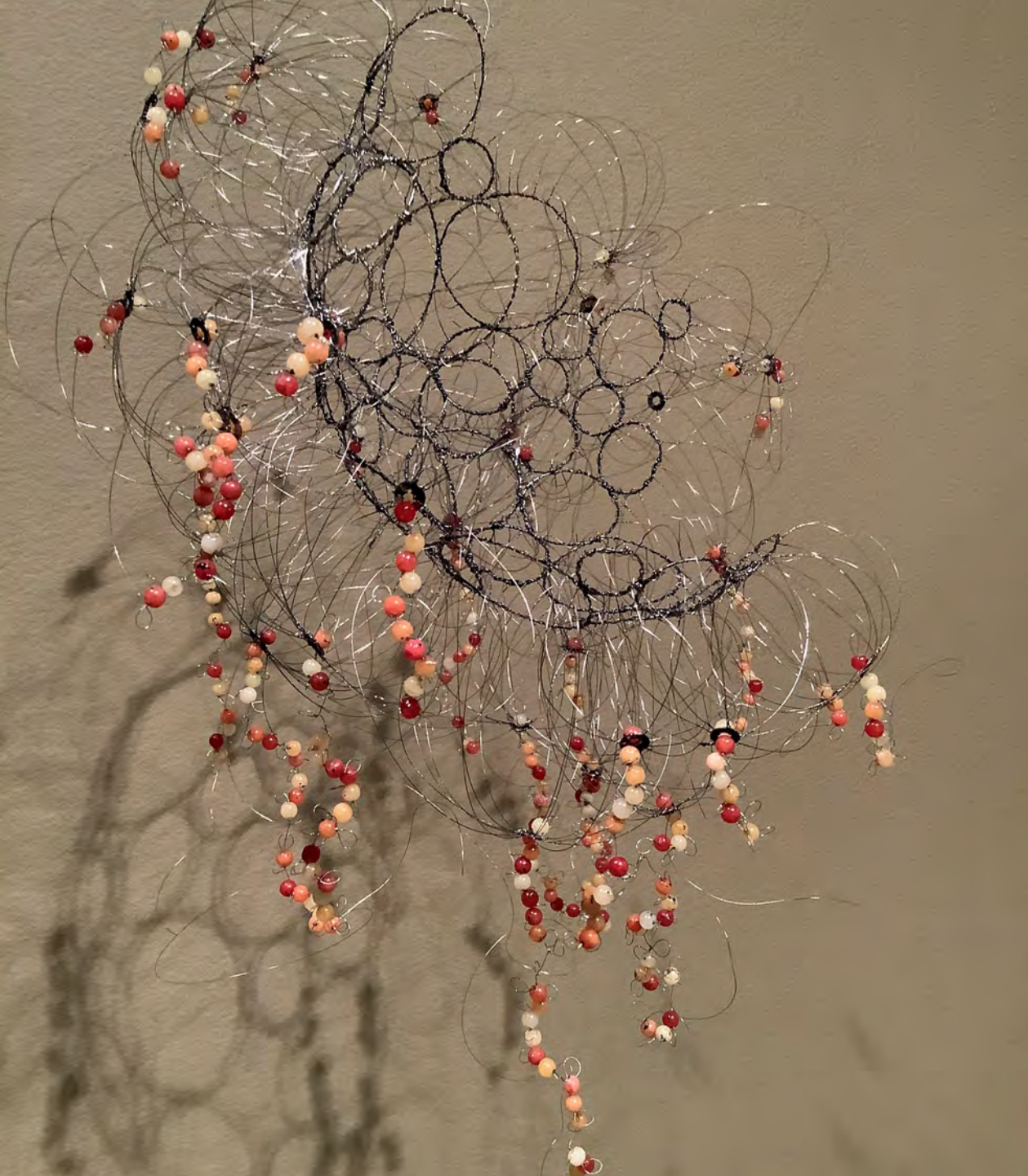

Meet the Artist

Anne Mudge is a nationally acclaimed sculptor and public artist who has shown at the Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, the List Visual Arts Center at M.I.T, the San Diego Museum of Art, the Delaware Center for Contemporary Art, the Metropolitan Museum and Art Center in Coral Gables, Florida, the California Center for the Arts Museum, among other public and private venues. Public art commissions include the North Park Gateway, the San Diego State University Transit Center, the San Diego International Airport, the County of San Diego's Planning and Permit Building, and a commission for the City of Moorpark, CA. Mudge often employs labor-intensive collaborations with materials and processes to reference living forms and systems.

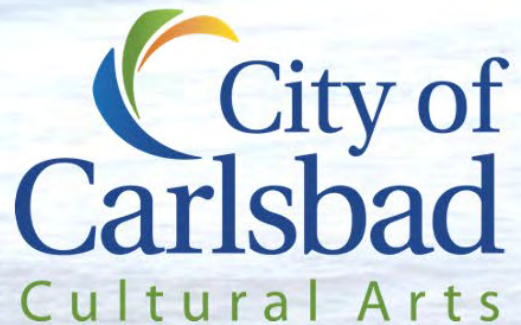

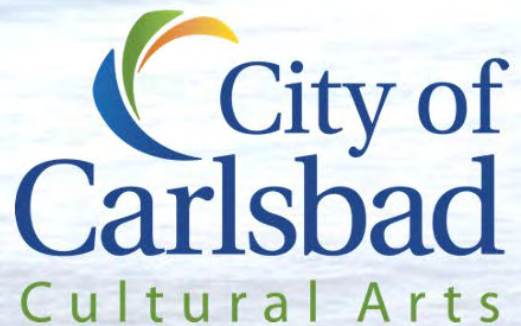

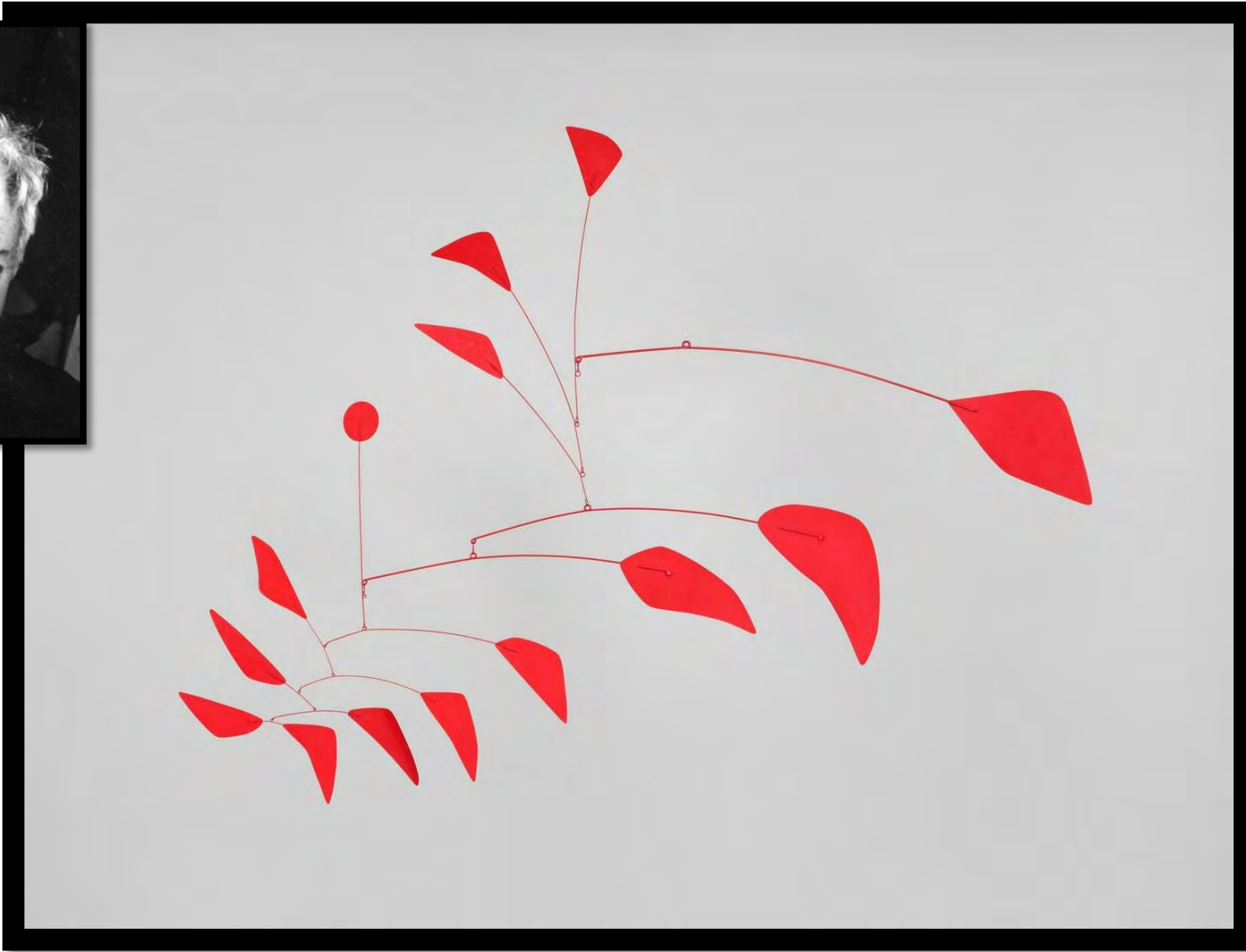
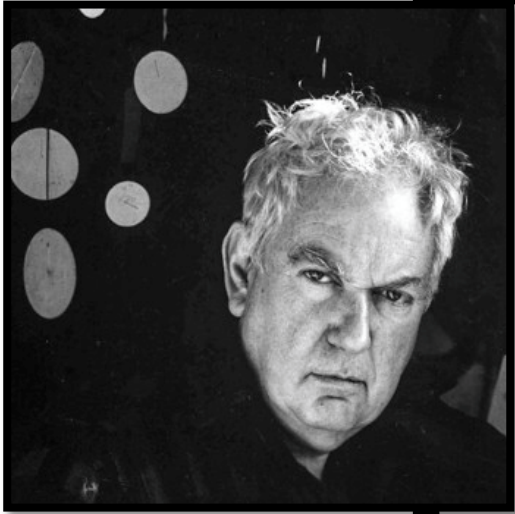
Amulet of Anubis on his Shrine ca. 1850-1775 BC



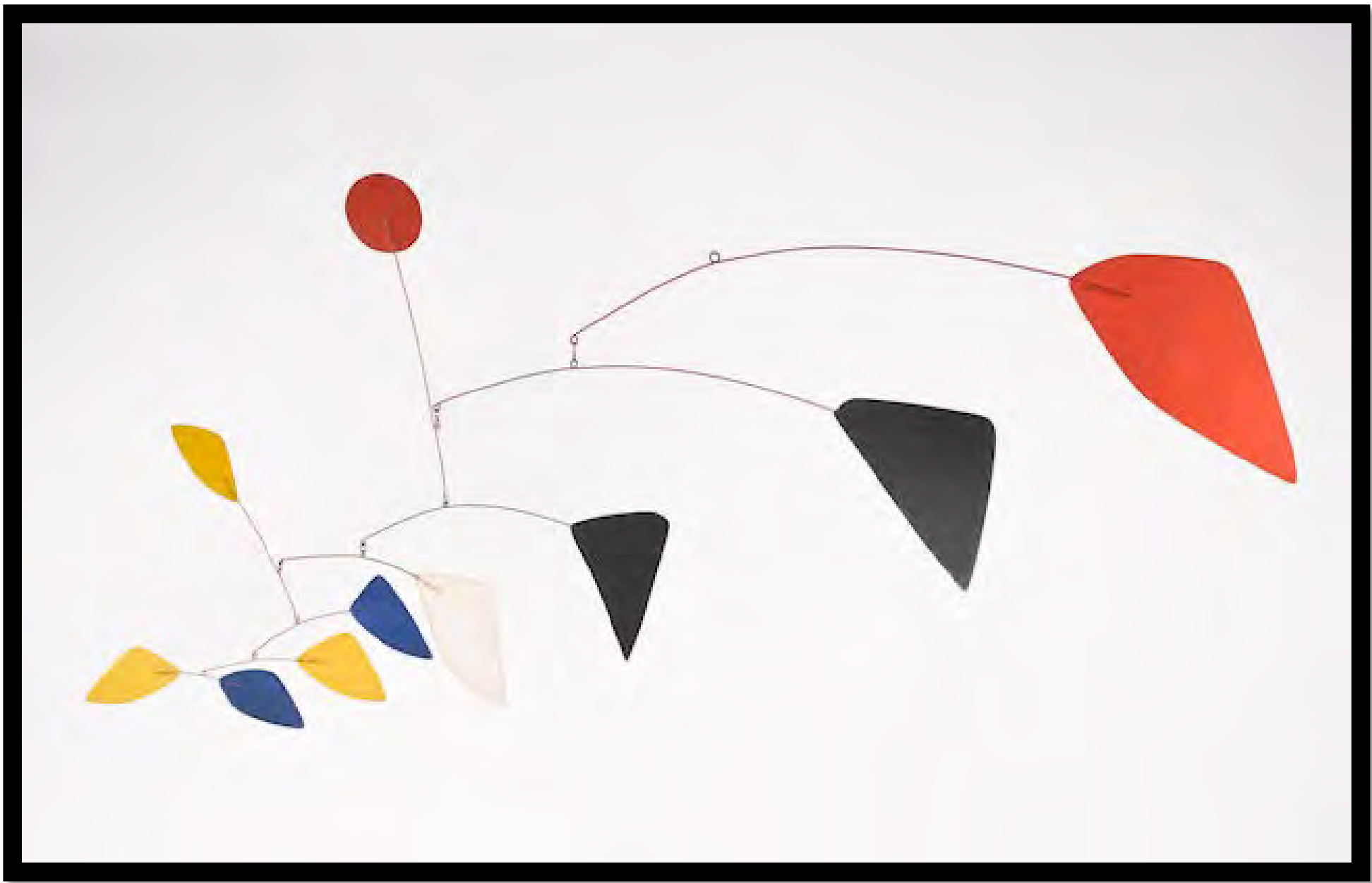
Antique Wire Kitchen Tools

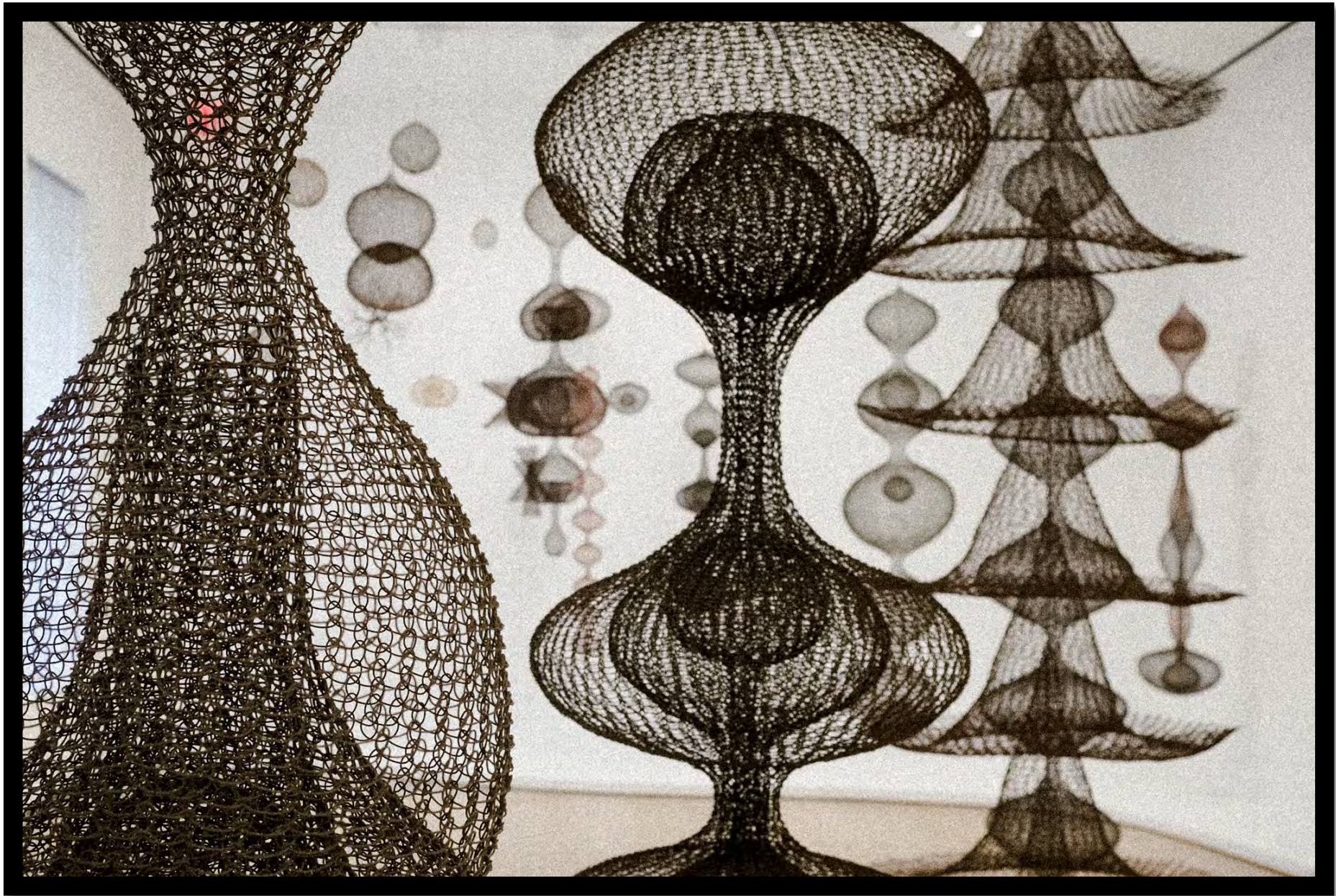

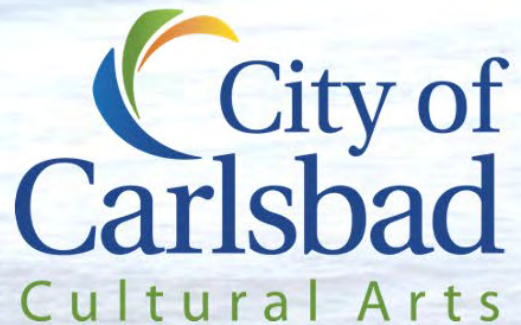

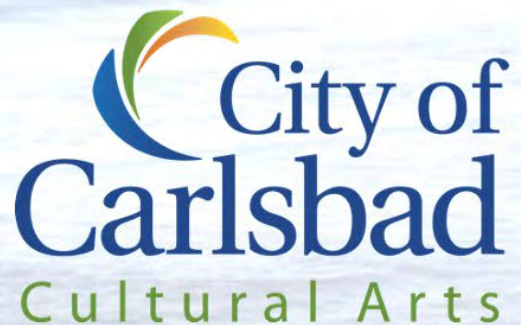
