










Meet the Artist

Barb Wills is an award-winning fiber artist whose amazing quilts have been exhibited in galleries and museums throughout the United States, Europe, Russia, and Asia. Her artworks are also in private, corporate, and museum collections around the world. Wills' quilts are influenced by the Arizona landscape where she lives and teaches. She says her inspiration and imagery come from her "natural environment of forests, mountains, rocks and marks on the ground and trails, on the trees and in the sky". The colors used to create her quilts are toned down and subtle. In her multi-layered quilts, viewers can see how beautiful the markmaking is, both closeup, and far away.




