At the Planning Commission meeting on January 13th 2021, some commissioners mistakenly think only people in the Ponto area want a park there. This is surely Not the case. I lived in the Village for most of the last 5 years, and yet I felt the need to volunteer for People 4 Ponto. That's because I had several parks, miles of beaches, and even a nature center within walking distance, and felt it wasn't right that South Carlsbad residents had zero coastal parks.

Now a resident of district 3, I want a coastal park at Ponto for myself, as do many residents and visitor serving businesses of both districts 3 & 4. Lack of access to coastal parks will be even more critical as sea levels rise. South Carlsbad already has significantly less beach access than North Carlsbad. One day very soon, Ponto beach and the Camp Grounds could be washed away. Then what?

We cannot keep ignoring the needs of half the city who have no coastal park, or coastal open space. In normal times there would be thousands of visitors, hotel, and resort guests staying in south Carlsbad each week. What coastal parks can they go to? Zero! Why would you want them to drive to Encinitas or Del Mar and spend their money on shops and restaurants there?

The highest and best use of the land at Ponto is for open space and low cost visitor serving recreation.
