Written Materials

Written materials related to the agenda that are submitted to the Independent Redistricting Commission after the agenda packet has been published will be available for review prior to the meeting during normal business hours at the City Clerk's Office, 1200 Carlsbad Village Drive and on the city website. To review these materials during the meeting, please see the City Clerk.

Visual Materials

Visual materials, such as pictures, charts, maps or slides, are allowed for comments on agenda items, not general public comment. Please contact the City Manager's Office at 760-434-2820 or manager@carlsbadca.gov to make arrangements in advance. All materials must be received by the City Manager's Office no later than noon the day before the meeting. The time spent presenting visual materials is included in the maximum time limit provided to speakers. All materials exhibited to the Independent Redistricting Commission during the meeting are part of the public record. Please note that video presentations during public comment are not allowed.

Decorum

All participants are expected to conduct themselves with mutual respect. Loud, boisterous and unruly behavior can interfere with the ability of the Independent Redistricting Commission to conduct the people's business. That's why it is illegal to disrupt an Independent Redistricting Commission meeting. Following a warning from the presiding officer, those engaging in disruptive behavior are subject to law enforcement action.

Independent Redistricting Commission Agenda

The Independent Redistricting Commission follows a regular order of business that is specified in the Carlsbad Municipal Code. The Commission may only make decisions about topics listed on the agenda.

Public Comment

Members of the public may speak on any redistricting related item that does not appear on the agenda. State law prohibits the Independent Redistricting Commission from taking action on items not listed on the agenda. Comments requiring follow up will be referred to staff and, if appropriate, considered at a future Independent Redistricting Commission meeting. Members of the public are also welcome to provide comments on agenda items during the portions of the meeting when those items are being discussed. In both cases, a request to speak form must be submitted to the clerk in advance of that portion of the meeting beginning.

New Business

This part of the agenda is for items presented to the Independent Redistricting Commission by city staff and can be informational in nature or require action. The staff report about each item indicates the purpose of the item and whether or not action is requested.

Other Reports

At the end of each meeting, Independent Redistricting Commission members and the city attorney and city clerk are given an opportunity to share information. This usually includes information about upcoming meetings and events.

Independent Redistricting Commission Actions

Motion

A motion is used to propose Independent Redistricting Commission direction related to an item on the agenda. Any Independent Redistricting Commission member may make a motion. A motion must receive a "second" from another Independent Redistricting Commission member to be eligible for a vote.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Commission Member Stanley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes of the Special Meeting held July 29, 2021.

Motion by Commission Member Ashton, seconded by Commission Member Stanley to amend Item No. 4 of the minutes to reflect that the commission requested staff provide the following documents: redistricting process costs, city agreement with NDC, City Council resolutions forming the commission and outreach documents provided to the public; and to approve said minutes once amended. Motion carried, 6/0/1 (Arndt-Absent).

Motion by Commission Member Ashton to approve the agenda at the beginning of the meeting in order to rearrange the order of presentations moving Item No. 3 to Item No. 1, Item No. 5 to Item No. 2 and Item No. 2 to Item No 3.

Ms. Medina explained the commission does have the option to move items on the agenda out of order for discussion. However, any approval required for an item will have to be obtained individually as the agenda is not a consent calendar agenda where the items can be approved as one item.

Motion failed due to a lack of a second.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS: (taken during the items)

NEW BUSINESS:

1. <u>ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING COMMISSION</u> – Receive a presentation from staff regarding the roles and responsibilities of the Independent Redistricting Commission. (Staff Contact: Sheila Cobian, City Manager's Office and Cindie McMahon, City Attorney's Office)

Legislative & Constituent Services Director Shelia Cobian provided the report and reviewed a PowerPoint presentation (on file in the Office of the City Clerk).

No public comment was received on this item.

2. <u>REVIEW OF REDISTRICTING TIMELINE AND MAJOR MILESTONES</u> – Receive a presentation from staff and National Demographics Corporation on the City of Carlsbad's redistricting timeline to include major milestones and public hearing format. (Staff Contact: Faviola Medina, City Clerk's Office)

National Demographics Corporation (NDC) representative Shannon Kelly reviewed a PowerPoint presentation on the redistricting timeline that included public hearings, mapping workshops, and commission meetings. She also provided the commission with an overview of the upcoming September 23, 2021 public hearing that included the commission's role and goals during the hearing.

Ms. Medina explained that due to the current city health order in place, meetings will be conducted virtually via zoom until the deadline of September 30, 2021. The meetings schedule will be updated if legislation changes or the emergency order is extended.

In response to an inquiry from Chair Fabiano, Ms. Kelly stated that NDC was prohibited by law from providing maps for three weeks following the released census data from the Secretary of State. She continued, stating that information shared with the commission during a public meeting will need to meet the advanced public noticing criteria. Public maps will be available for drawing and viewing on the website.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Cadwallader, Assistant City Attorney McMahon explained that the hands-on public workshops are not intended for the commission's participation and are not scheduled to be noticed as such. The workshops will be streamed and available for viewing.

Commission Member Ashton expressed her concerns regarding the words "City Council" in the title of redistricting documents explaining that it could cause confusion for the public. She also stated she was not aware the commission approved the entire commission schedule at the July 29, 2021 meeting.

Motion by Commission Member Ashton that the commission approve the meeting schedule for all public meetings, all regular commission meetings, all public hearings, and all mapping workshops in its entirety as an independent redistricting commission meeting schedule.

Commission discussion ensued on what was adopted by the Commission at its July 29, 2021 meeting.

Ms. McMahon explained the commission adopted a meeting schedule that included the public hearing schedule at its July 29, 2021 meeting. She further provided that the mapping workshops are required by City Council. The dates and timeline of the mapping workshops are determined when staff believes the census data will be available.

Commission Member Ashton withdrew her motion regarding adopting the meeting schedule.

Commission Member Ashton reiterated her concerns regarding public perception if the title of the meeting schedule and commission presentation documents are not changed to reflect only the Independent Redistricting Commission.

Commission discussion ensued on changing the title on the schedule.

Motion by Commission Member Ashton to change the title of the meeting schedule to the City of Carlsbad Redistricting Meeting Schedule. The commission is responsible for the requirements in meeting the deadline, and to include the distinction in verbal and written presentations made to the commission.

NDC consultant representative Shannon Kelly clarified that elements of NDC documents are intended to provide a generic education to the public in what way state law governs how cities redistrict. She added that NDC will be cognizant of the title of documents going forward.

Motion failed due to a lack of a second.

Motion by Commission Member Cadwallader, seconded by Chair Fabiano, to change the meeting schedule title to the City of Carlsbad Redistricting Meeting Schedule. Motion carried 6/0/1 (Arndt-Absent).

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Sardina, Assistant City Attorney McMahon explained the process of adopting the final map which will require the commission to adopt a resolution with an affirmative vote of four of the commission members. Once the resolution has passed, the map will take effect immediately.

No public comment was received on this item.

3. <u>PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT IN THE REDISTRICTING PROCESS</u> – Receive a presentation regarding plans to engage the public in the redistricting process and provide feedback as desired. (Staff Contact: Kristina Ray, Communication & Engagement Department)

Communication and Engagement Department Director Kristina Ray and Community Relations Manager Bree Robertoy gave the report and PowerPoint presentation (on file in the Office of the City Clerk).

Ms. Ray asked the commission for its input on groups that should be added to community organizations, for other types of information other than that already produced, and feedback on the website.

Chair Fabiano asked if it was possible to send an information insert in the city's utility bills.

Ms. Ray responded that while possible, it is not included in the redistricting budget. She added that the plan is to put material out at community centers, libraries, and the Carlsbad Senior Center.

Chair Fabiano asked for staff to present a printing cost estimate for a communication document to be inserted in city utility bills at the October 28, 2021 commission meeting.

Commission Member Harris and Chair Fabiano suggested partnering with the school districts in Carlsbad to communicate with parents.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Stanley, Ms. Ray confirmed the city was paying for ads.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Ashton, Ms. Ray responded that the consultant is contacting leaders of organizations.

No public comment was received on this item.

4. <u>OVERVIEW OF MAPPING TOOLS</u> – Receive a presentation from National Demographics Corporation overviewing the mapping tools to be used in the redistricting process. (Staff Contact: Faviola Medina, City Clerk's Office)

NDC consultant representative Shannon Kelly gave the overview and PowerPoint presentation to the Commission on using the mapping tools (on file in the Office of the City Clerk).

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Ashton, Ms. Kelly explained that the first draft maps presented for the public to view at the public hearing on November 13, 2021, will also include a summary of all of the maps that have been submitted to that point. Further maps will be provided at the January 13, 2022 public hearing.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Ashton, Ms. Kelly explained that in the materials supplied by NDC, racial gerrymandering is mentioned because it is a federal requirement. State law also requires it to be noted that political gerrymandering is not permitted. NDC will guide and advise the commission to use best practices to avoid all gerrymandering that would intentionally disadvantage anyone. Ms. Kelly further added that everything submitted from the public will be analyzed by NDC considering what it must have to meet legal criteria and that information will be shared with the commission.

Commission Member Ashton asked about providing information to all non-English speaking Carlsbad residents.

Ms. Kelly responded the Secretary of State determines the minimum of providing information to non-English speaking residents and identifies with the language that is spoken and not a person who may identify with another ethnicity. The Secretary of State declared the City of Carlsbad does not have to provide information to non-English speaking residents.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Cadwallader, Ms. Kelly said districting for the city is based on population. Census bureau data for analyzation is provided by the American Communities Survey based on citizens voting age population (CVAP).

No public comment was received on this item.

5. <u>PUBLIC INPUT RECEIVED</u> – Consider input provided by the public. (Staff Contact: Kristina Ray, Communication & Engagement Department).

Communication and Engagement Department Director Kristina Ray explained this item was placed on the agenda for information purposes only. She added, information will be presented on future agendas in this type of format for the commission to view received public input.

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Ashton, staff explained that emails are reviewed and answered by staff as they are received. Assistant City Attorney McMahon also said emails directed to the City Attorney's office were answered and the information was posted in the commonly asked questions area on the website. An email address has been created for this specific purpose.

Discussion ensued among commissioners and staff regarding the commission's desire to view questions submitted and staff responses about the redistricting process.

Motion by Commission Member Ashton, seconded by Commission Member Sardina, requesting that staff responses to the public's emails on redistricting also be provided in the public input section of the commission agenda packet. Motion carried 6/0/1 (Arndt – Absent).

No public comment was received on this item.

STAFF AND COMMITTEE MEMBER REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:

In response to an inquiry from Commission Member Cadwallader, City Clerk Services Manager Medina explained she would link the new development projects list and open space map to the redistricting page on the city's website.

Subject: Commission Discussion and Direction to National Demographics

Corporation Regarding Communities of Interest and Other Elements to Be

Incorporated Into Draft Maps

Recommended Action

That the Independent Redistricting Commission provide direction to National Demographics Corporation on communities of interest and other elements the Commission would like to see incorporated in the draft maps to be presented to the Commission on Dec. 16, 2021.

Discussion

The intention of this item is for the Commission to discuss and identify the neighborhoods, communities of interest, and other local factors that should be considered or used as building blocks for the drawing of draft maps by National Demographics Corporation. While all public input concerning the composition of the city's districts should be considered, all maps must meet the following federal requirements:

- 1. Population equality across districts.
- 2. Race cannot be the predominant factor or criteria when drawing districts.
- 3. Compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, which, among other things, prohibits districts that dilute minority voting rights, and encourages a majority-minority district, if the minority group is sufficiently large, and such a district can be drawn without race being the predominant factor.

Additionally, the maps must also meet the following state requirements:

- Maps must be drawn using the following criteria in prioritized order:
 - District boundaries must be geographically contiguous;
 - Districts boundaries must minimize the division of neighborhoods and communities of interest;
 - Districts boundaries must be easily identifiable and understandable by residents;
 and
 - District boundaries must be geographically compact.
- Maps must not favor or discriminate against a political party.
- Maps must be accompanied by information on the total population, citizen voting age population, and racial and ethnic characteristics of the citizen voting age population.

Next Steps

The next regular public meeting of the Commission is scheduled for Dec. 16, 2021. The Commission will also hold two more public hearings concerning the proposed city district boundaries on Jan. 13, 2022 and Feb. 17, 2022. At the conclusion of the final public hearing on Feb. 17, 2022, the Independent Redistricting Commission may adopt a resolution approving the final map.

Discussion

The attached is Carlsbad Housing Element Advisory Committee Map showing Potential Housing Sites and the number of expected housing units.

Total housing units shown is 2,828.

All but 325 unit are located North of Palomar Airport Rd in current district 1 & 2 with rough balance.

The 325 unit are located just South of Palomar Airport Rd.

There are No units shown for current District 4.

Using a factor of 2 would yield an additional population of 5,656.

Using a factor of 3 would yield an additional population of 8,484.

The expected population growth needs to be taken into account when sizing each district.

To aid in maintaining a nearer balance in district size for the next 10 years, based upon the Census the Northern districts of Carlsbad should have lower population count then the Southern districts of Carlsbad and the Southern districts of Carlsbad should have a higher population count than the Northern districts with all being within the 10% rule.

As has been shared with the Commission, we are in unprecedented times in terms of Census Data this year. Data that should have been released in April 2021 did not come out until August. Then, the State of California did its new prisoner adjustments of the data. That was not finalized until September 27, 2021. In an effort to help the Carlsbad Independent Redistricting Commission get started and engage the public, we decided to elevate the first available redistricting tools as soon as possible with estimated population data. The demographic elements from the American Community Survey are actuals. We were pleased that the paper mapping kits have been updated with final population data already and expect to have District R updated shortly. Under this plan, members of the public have been able to engage in the process with both tools without delay. Any maps created on District R can be updated once final California-adjusted population data is uploaded.

Subject: Update on outreach requested through water bill inserts and print ads

Recommended Action

Receive a staff presentation regarding an update on raising awareness of the redistricting process through water bill inserts and print ads, as directed by the Independent Redistricting Commission.

Discussion

The Carlsbad City Council directed staff to go beyond state requirements for engaging the community in the redistricting process. Some of these enhanced outreach activities have included:

- 4 informational meetings
- 2 mapping workshops
- Flyer distribution via local schools and community organizations
- Print advertisement for public hearing #1
- Social media
- Digital advertising
- An informational video

To better reach community members who may not utilize digital communication channels, the Independent Redistricting Commission directed staff at its Oct. 28, 2021, meeting to place informational inserts into water bills distributed in the City of Carlsbad and place two ads in the Coast News. City staff will also dedicate the City Matters column in the January/February issue of Carlsbad Magazine to the topic of redistricting. As a result, community members will have an opportunity to see multiple pieces of information about redistricting in a print format over a two-month period of time.

Status

Three water districts operate in the City of Carlsbad. The Carlsbad Municipal Water District serves approximately 85% of the city. The other two districts are separate government agencies, not controlled by the City of Carlsbad.

City staff has designed the water bill insert and presented it for approval to the Vallecitos and Olivenhain Municipal water districts. The Olivenhain Municipal Water District declined to include the insert in its bills due to concern about creating confusion among customers because the district is also undergoing a redistricting process. Vallecitos has not yet decided.

The insert is anticipated to be delivered to Carlsbad Municipal Water District customers at various dates primarily in December and January.

City staff has reserved ad space with the Coast News for the Dec. 31, 2021 and Jan. 7, 2022 issues.

Budget

To accomplish this direction, staff has reallocated approximately \$3,700 in funding from the redistricting public outreach budget that had previously been directed toward online and social media advertising and printing flyers for distribution at city facilities. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, foot traffic at city facilities has been lower than normal, so reducing the number of fliers available is not expected to have a material effect on the overall effectiveness of the public outreach efforts. Likewise, the city will be able to continue digital advertising, just at a lower level of frequency than previously planned.

Fiscal Analysis

This action has no fiscal impact.

Environmental Evaluation

In keeping with California Public Resources Code Section 21065, this action does not constitute a "project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act in that it has no potential to cause either a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

Public Notification and Outreach

This item was noticed in keeping with the Ralph M. Brown Act and it was available for public viewing and review at least 72 hours before the scheduled meeting date.
