Mapping workshops were focused on use of the mapping tools and how the public can use them to share maps and/or thoughts about communities of interest


However, through dialogue in the workshops, some feedback was shared by members of the public including:

- All districts having a piece of the coastline is good.
- Can we incorporate 4 quadrants concept in the map?
- Using the core of the current map and just adjusting for population is better than starting over. The last map was done well.
- We should keep school districts all in one City Council district.
