NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN the City of Carlsbad Independent Redistricting Commission will hold a public hearing at 6 p.m., virtually, on the following date:

Thursday, Feb. 17, 2022

The purpose of the public hearing is to receive public input on and provide input regarding the composition of potential Council election district boundaries. Following the public hearing, the Commission will select a final map of four City Council Districts based on the 2020 Decennial Federal Census.

All interested parties are invited to participate in the public hearing and express opinions or submit information. In the interest of public health and safety, we are temporarily taking actions to prevent and mitigate the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic by holding public meetings online only. All public meetings will comply with public noticing requirements in the Brown Act and will be made accessible electronically to all members of the public seeking to observe and address the Commission. Participation in writing: email comments to redistricting@carlsbadca.gov. Comments received by 4 p.m. the day prior to the meeting will be shared with the Commission prior to the meeting. When e-mailing comments, please identify in the subject line the agenda item to which your comments relate. All comments received will be included as part of the official record. Written comments will not be read out loud.
