Subject: Deliberation on Proposals for Funding

Recommended Action

That the Community Development Block Grant Advisory Committee deliberate on the requests for funding and develop a recommendation for City Council consideration and approval.

Executive Summary

The role of the CDBG Advisory Committee is to consider the needs of the low/moderate income households of Carlsbad and make recommendations to the City Council to fund activities which are "'the most qualified" to meet those needs.

The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the applicants request for funding and develop recommendations for funding. This is the third meeting of three total meetings.

Discussion

Available funding

The estimated budget of the FY 2022-23 Funding Plan is \$527,154, and it is based on the city's prior year entitlement.

The budget outlined in the Funding Plan, includes the anticipated entitlement of \$527,154, and the maximum percentage of 15% of the annual grant for dedicated funding for public services and 20% for administrative costs, which are HUD-regulated caps and cannot be adjusted upward.

Local Objectives

The three national objectives are identified as: benefiting low- and moderate-income persons; preventing or eliminating slums or blight; and meeting urgent needs. The city's local objectives are identified as:

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Priority 1: Increase and preserve affordable housing opportunities for low- and moderate-income households

Priority 2: Prevent and reduce homelessness

Priority 3: Strengthen support services for residents with special needs

Priority 4: Improve and provide facilities to serve people with low incomes

Priority 5: Provide fair housing services to residents

Deliberation

Following the interview of each eligible proposal/application, Advisory Committee Members and staff will complete their evaluation of the proposal according to the criteria outlined in the Request for Proposals. Committee Members will then submit their proposal scores to staff for averaging and as a starting point for discussion.

It is the Advisory Committee's responsibility to make a recommendation on the level of funding to be allocated to the eligible activities according to the order the proposals/applications are ranked. The Advisory Committee shall discuss the applications and recommend a funding level for the proposals until all available funds have been allocated to eligible activities.

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
